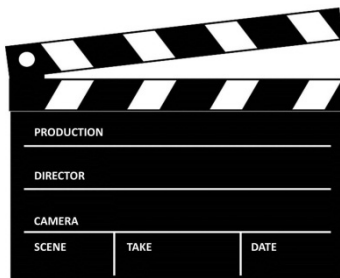

We are also very pleased to announce that this year we have two sponsors for our fete, namely Londis and Legis Solicitors.

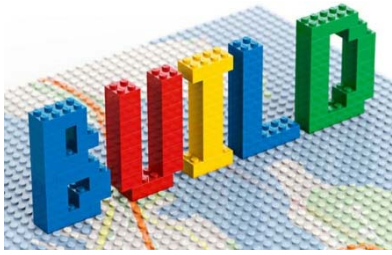

Uniform

We would like to remind parents and children that there is a requirement to wear the correct uniform at all times! As the warmer weather has arrived the children may now wear the summer uniform.

Girls:

Light sky blue check dress, or black skirt and white polo shirt with school logo both to be worn with white socks.

Boys:

White polo shirt with school logo, worn with black shorts and black or grey socks.

Children are not required to wear a tie with the summer uniform. To assist our parents, we will be posting a photo guide to the correct uniform on the school website in the near future.

If you would like your child to wear sun cream during the day please apply it before they arrive in school as we are unable to do so during the day. A hat is a very good idea too! Uniform checks are now being carried out, please do not view these as a 'telling off' rather than a friendly reminder.

A very small number of parents have raised a concern over the new school uniform supplier. While the new jumpers may feel slightly thinner than the previous ones, having taken a sample and washed it many times we found that it stood up very well to this test. The children wearing the new jumpers have been wearing them for quite a few weeks now and to our awareness none of the new jumpers have developed holes and ripped cuffs as the ones from the previous supplier do. Another bonus from the new supplier is that the school receives a donation from the sale of every item of clothing and in these times of austerity every penny counts! The alternative to buying the jumpers etc. online is for us to appoint an official uniform supplier, such as, but not necessarily, Lucilla's in Ilford, requiring the parents to go to the shop and queue while waiting for their child's uniform. We felt that an online supplier was the best option for our parents. Please remember that you will need to order your children's uniform for the next academic year soon as the supplier will get very busy and may not be able to take your order if you leave it to the last minute.

A number of our children representing the Commonwealth Youth Choir performed at this year's 'Beating the Retreat' ceremony. It is a very prestigious event attended by among others, HRH Prince Andrew, Baroness Scotland the new Secretary General of the Commonwealth and over 8,000 paying customers!

However, please have a look at some pictures taken by Mrs Britton during the rehearsal on Tuesday and by Mr Underwood on the day of the event.

It was a spectacular show with the 150 children joined by 150 members of the Royal Choral Society and 600 bandmen from the Royal Household Divisions.

At the finale of the show our children were centre stage, singing the new

Commonwealth song written by Major Haw of the Coldstream Guards. An incredible experience for them as a firework show and a flypast by World War II Spitfires were happening simultaneously!

Undoubtedly an awe inspiring sight and Mr Underwood has never been so proud of children from the school. Indeed Baroness Scotland commented that the children 'stole the show'.
