


Progress in reading, writing and maths

This week's data from the Department for Education shows how our key Stage 2 results compare with schools both locally and nationally. As you can see the children's results (93% of the children reached the expected standard across all three indicators) were far above the Newham average of 62% and the national average of 52%. Once again, well done to all those involved! There isn't a school within 75 miles of St Winefride's that does anywhere as well


