This became known as the 'Sermon on the Mount'. Just as Jesus wanted all his followers to be happy, so do we wish all our children and parents to be happy and safe too. ## School Uniform

After much thought and requests by parents, the Governors of the school agreed to alter the uniform requirements, to allow children to wear black trainers to school, instead of insisting on black school shoes. At the time it was announced that if children 'pushed the boundaries' and wore brightly coloured trainers the Governors would reconsider their decision and revert to insisting on proper formal black shoes. Please also note that trainers and plimsolls for PE should also be black. As a school we have never

Where this should be a fun app for everyone to enjoy, the fact that users are able to live stream content means that people claiming to be young children, are actually much older predators, who may be asking the children to do totally inappropriate things. Please do not leave your children to use this app or others like it when they are in a separate room

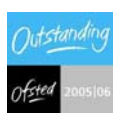

While they may be perfectly innocent games, if there is ANY type of live streaming, ways of sharing content, leaving messages, these are all things predators seek to exploit. *Please check all of the games and apps your children are using to see if they are suitable and age appropriate. Most apps, including Facebook, Whats App, Instagram, Snap Chat are for age 13 and above!*

## Communion Classes

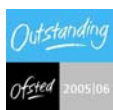
The annual Communion classes begin next Tuesday, the first session being in St Stephen's. The session will end at 3:45pm so please remember set an alarm to pick them up.
