

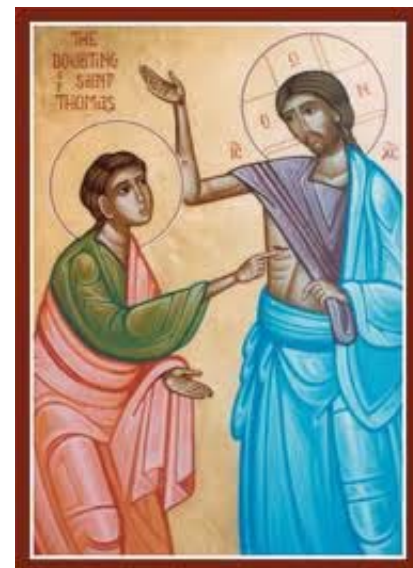

At the end of the day the rules are there to make everyone safe and so that's why they are there.



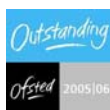
Commonwealth Youth Orchestra

Monsignor George Stokes

It is with great sadness that we relate to you the passing of Monsignor George Stokes, until very recently the Director of Education for the Diocese of Brentwood. Following is a message from Bishop Alan Williams :

You will be very sorry to hear that Mgr George Stokes died this morning (27th April) at Nazareth House following his recent illness.

Fr George was born in Cape Town in 1941 and came to England as a child where his family settled in Grays. He was ordained to the Anglican ministry in 1965 and served in Newcastle-upon-Tyne. He was received into the Catholic Church in 1969 and studied for the Priesthood from at St Edmund's College, Ware from 1970-1972 and at the Venerable English College, Rome from 1972-1976. He was ordained by Bishop Casey at the VEC in Rome on 10th April 1976.

He served as Assistant Priest, Leigh-on-Sea from 1977-1981; served the BRES Team from 1981-2016; Chaplain to the Bernadine Nuns, Westcliff-on-Sea from 1981-1983; Chaplain to Ursuline Convent, Brentwood from 1983-1986; Administrator for Brentwood Cathedral 1986-1991; Diocesan Director of Education 1991-2016. He resided at Our Lady Immaculate 1991-2008 and Grays 2008-2016 when he moved to Nazareth House. He was appointed Domestic Prelate (Monsignor) in 2005.

Mgr George Stokes served the Diocese with great generosity and dedication. He was well respected by all who knew him and his expertise, especially in the area of education, was greatly valued.

Details of his funeral will be sent when known.

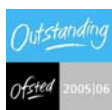
Great Cafod Balloon Race

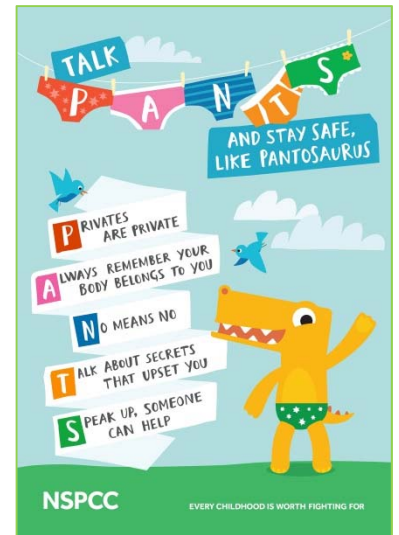
Safeguarding Update

As you may know the school recently underwent a Safeguarding Audit, and part of the requirements were that we continue to update our parents on a regular basis about the steps we are taking to keep the children safe. This term we will be discussing the NSPCC's PANTS rules. These are designed to teach pupils how to stay safe from sexual abuse, without giving explicit information or telling scary stories or even using the term "sexual abuse". Children will learn about the 'PANTS' acrostic, which stands for:

- Privates are private.
- Always remember your body belongs to you.
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help.

The sessions will be fully age-appropriate.

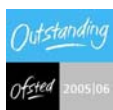

For every child that is registered on this website the school receives extra funding that may only be spent on children on this register. It is also used to register for Free School Meals. Although School Meals are currently free ***this is only guaranteed until the end of this school year.*** So PLEASE go to the above website and check if you are eligible.
